

# **Dave Ward Memorial Scholarship Application**

## **INTRODUCTION AND INSTRUCTIONS**

### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the Dave Ward Memorial Scholarship (DWMS) is to provide limited financial assistance each year to a student pursuing an advanced education (post high school) based on an understanding of U.S. citizenship. An essay entitled, "What Citizenship Means to Me", is the primary method of selection for the award in the amount of \$1000. The Monumental Rifle and Pistol Club, Inc., established this scholarship in honor of Dave Ward, a past member of the club, who was known both for his fun and creative recreational shooting events and for his strong desire for good citizenship and education. Combining his two interest areas, this scholarship is open to all Maryland high school juniors and seniors who plan to pursue advanced (post high school) education.

### **ELIGIBILITY**

Any junior or senior Maryland student may apply for the DWMS. An eligible student should write an essay on citizenship and complete an application as described below. All listed questions and information must be supplied. Proper grammar and good writing skills are expected. The applicant will certify that the "What Citizenship Means to Me" essay is their own original work. Any evidence to the contrary will eliminate the applicant from the selection process.

### **APPLICATION**

The application will take the general form below. The application deadline is July 15, 2011. After initial review of the essay and application, all applicants will be encouraged to attend a Monumental meeting as described below during the months of August or September.

### **SELECTION**

All applications will be reviewed by the Monumental DWMS committee. The written essay will count for the majority of the selection criteria and will be augmented by other supporting information in the application, which will be used to judge the suitability and the desirability of the applicant.

### **AWARDING**

A certificate of award will be delivered to the applicant by mail or, if possible, in person at a Monumental meeting. The cash value of the award will be stated, but delivery of the actual funds will be delayed until the awardee provides the DWMS committee with a copy of a letter of acceptance or other suitable evidence that the student will be attending

an institution of higher learning within the next 90 days. At that time, the funds will be delivered to the student or his guardian, if still a minor, for direct use toward any cost related to this continuing education.

Submit the essay, type written double spaced and approximately 3 to 5 pages in length. Correct grammar, spelling and document structure is expected. All sources of information, particularly quoted passages, should be identified, footnoted, and documented.

### **Part 5: Transcripts**

Provide a copy of an official transcript of grades for the last two full years and part year to date (if applicable). If home schooled, provide a notice of evaluation from the local board of education.

### **Part 6: Recommendations**

Attach two recommendations from individuals well known to you, but not related to you. One should be a school-related contact and the other from outside of school.

**Part 7: Certification and signature**

I certify that the above information is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and that the written essay is an original work prepared by me. Any information or statement contrary to this certification may make me ineligible for the Dave Ward Memorial Scholarship award. I understand that the application will be reviewed by several individuals and that information submitted may be verified by those reviewing this application. I authorize and encourage individuals and organizations I have cited in the application to supply or confirm any information necessary for me to participate in the Dave Ward Memorial Scholarship.
